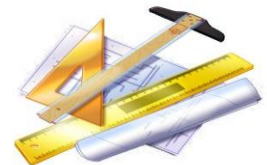

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RULES & REGULATIONS OF THE DELORAINE AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY

1. All entrants must get a display number from the secretary. There is a \$2.00 entry fee for adults, no fee in Junior section, unless they enter into the adult categories, then there is a \$2.00 entry fee.
2. All entries must be tagged and in the display building by 11:30 A.M. Friday of the fair weekend.
3. All entries must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor, and must be from the current year.
4. In the absence of competition in any section or article exhibited be of an inferior quality, or if the judges are instructed to award only premiums as they think the exhibit deserving of, they will award first, second, or any prize.
5. Only one entry will be allowed an exhibitor in one section of a class, but the judges may report to the board any article of merit and the directors may grant honorary certificates.
6. No persons shall be allowed to interfere with the judges while in the discharge of their duties, exhibitors so interfering, except for asking the judge for his reason for his decision, will forfeit the right to any premiums to which they otherwise might be entitled.
7. Senior entrants only winners tags will be opened, junior entrants all tags will be opened.
8. All articles must remain until the close of the exhibition at 8:00 P.M. Saturday of the fair. Display building will be locked at 8 P.M. while directors dismantle exhibition, and exhibitors can take charge of same at 8:30 P.M.
9. The directors will take every possible precaution under the circumstance to ensure the safety of the articles sent to the exhibition, should any of the articles be accidentally damaged, injured, lost or stolen, they will not make any payment to the value thereof.
10. Any infringement of the rules and regulations will be punished by with-holding prizes, expulsion from the society or both.
11. Prize money will be paid as soon as possible after the fair.
12. The Deloraine Agricultural Society will not be responsible for accidents or injuries to any person or persons or any race horses or livestock while on the Society's grounds.
13. No magazine or other agents will be allowed to sell or canvas subscriptions on the Society's grounds during the fair and races.
14. All automobiles have free parking space and will be parked at the owner's risk.

There will be a **COURT OF HONOUR** displaying the **BEST OF THE SHOW** in Horticultural, Canning, Cakes, Breads, Baking, Sewing, Quilts, Knitting, Crocheting and Handicrafts, as picked by the Judges.

All fruits and vegetables must be heat processed in hot water bath. To add acidity to tomato juice and tomatoes, you can add a small amount of citric acid or lemon juice. Jams must be processed in hot water bath, paraffin is no longer acceptable. Oven canning is not a safe method of preserving. Please loosen metal rings, so judges can open. Make sure the seal is NOT broken.

- Fruits -**
- 55 – Appearance, condition of finished product, original shape, natural color, free from blemishes, liquid clear, no sediment, portion 1/3 liquid to 2/3 solid.
 - 30 – Pack, pieces uniform
 - 10 – Container clean, appropriate size and shape
 - 5 – Label, small, neat, visible, state name, date, canning method

Pickles & Relish

- 25 – Appearance, color, appetizing, uniform size pieces, no milkiness of liquid
- 30 – Texture, crisp, no shrivelled or hollow pickles
- 5 – Seal
- 5 – Container, clean, free of rust
- 5 – Label, name of product, date processed

Jams, Conserves & Marmalade

- 25 – Appearance, color, fruit does not float
- 30 – Texture, size of fruit, thickness of jam
- 30 – Flavour
- 5 – Container, clean, suitable
- 5 – Seal, snap lid

Jelly

- 25 – Appearance, natural color, clear sparkling
- 30 – Texture, size of fruit, thickness of jelly
- 30 – Flavour

ORANGE CHIFFON CAKE

1 ½ cups Robin Hood flour	1 tsp. salt	1 tsp. vanilla
1 ½ cups sugar	5 egg yolk, unbeaten	3 Tbsp orange rind
3 tsp. baking powder	½ cup Mazola oil	7 egg whites, room temperature
Juice of 1 orange + cold water or orange juice to make ¾ cup liquid	½ tsp. cream tartar	

Stir four, 1 cup sugar, baking powder, and salt at least 3 or 4 times in large bowl. Make a well in center, add egg yolks, oil and orange juice, rind and vanilla. Mix well with wooden spoon. Beat egg whites till frothy. Add cream tartar, beat for 10 minutes, adding ½ cup sugar, gradually. Gently fold egg yolk mixture with egg whites, folding over. Do not beat. Pour into ungreased 10 inch tube pan. Bake 1 hour at 325F. Test for done with spaghetini. Tip over immediately onto turned over cup. Let cool.

Breads & Buns – all loaves to be oblong in shape, approximately 1 – 2 lb.

- 15 – Appearance, well shaped, color even, golden brown top & bottom
- 15 – Crust 1/8” thick, free from cracks, tender crisp
- 30 – Internal appearance, even creamy color, not streaky
- 40 – Flavour and odour, not yeasty, sweet, nutty flavour

Biscuits 25 – Appearance, color even brown, no spots or excess flour

- 30 – Texture even, light, and flaky
- 5 –Crust tender
- 40 – Flavour appetizing

Pastry Two Crusts

- 20 – 1 serving piece: Appearance, even golden brown, glaze uniform, if used
- 20 – Top crust, tender, flaky, medium thick, edges evenly browned and held to lower crust
- 20 – Under crust, tender, flaky, medium thickness, not soggy, golden brown
- 40 – Filling, holds shape when served, medium depth, characteristic flavour

Pastry One Crust

- 20 – 1 serving piece: Appearance, even golden brown, glaze uniform, if used
- 20 – Crust, golden brown, not soggy
- 20 – Flavour, characteristic of filling and crust
- 40 – Filling, holds shape when served, medium depth. Meringue golden brown, tender, cuts without pulling, no weeping, sealed to crust, medium thickness.

Cakes 30 – Appearance, evenly risen, even brown crust, frosting not necessarily smooth and not too thick

- 30 – Internal appearance, even color, fine even texture, light tender springy, not too dry, not soggy in the center
- 30 – Flavour
- 10 – Icing, smooth. Not granular, holds shape, suits type of cake

Fruit Cake 30 – Appearance, even color, tender crust

- 40 – Texture and quality, holds together, not damp in center or on top
- 30 – Flavour, mellowing of fruit flavour throughout, not too spicy

Cookies 25 – Appearance, even size and shape, even colour, free from surface flour

- 30 – Texture, tender, rich, and fruit distributed evenly
- 10 – Thickness to suit mixture
- 35 – Flavour

- 20 – Internal appearance
- 30 – Flavour and odour
- 30 – Nutrition

Manitoba Association of Agricultural Societies(MASS) Provincial Quilt Competition
Rules and Regulations: (Subject to changes)

1. Competition is open to all quilt exhibitors who have not won first prize in the Agricultural Societies’ Provincial Competition in the past three years.
2. The judging criteria used for judging is included in the “Judging Standards” book.
3. Entry can be hand quilted or machine quilted. No commercial quilting will be allowed.
- The entry must be quilted by the person submitting the quilt.**
4. Quilts must have an appropriate title.
5. Quilts must be at least 152 cm x 178 cm (60” x 70”) to be considered for the competition.
6. A Score Sheet will be distributed to all societies which must be used to judge the quilts. Any quilt not scoring 70 or more points will not qualify for the district or final competition.
7. Each society may select three quilts at their fair to participate in the district competition. Up to four quilts will be chosen at the district competition to go to the provincial competition, either machine or hand quilted.
8. Exhibitors may enter more than one quilt in this competition. However, they may only have one quilt advance to the provincial finals.
9. Any quilt may be entered in competition at as many fairs as the exhibitor wishes. However, it may only represent the society where it was first entered in the provincial competition and won. The exhibitor must advise societies at the time of entry if the quilt is a winner at a previous fair.
10. If an exhibitor does not wish to participate in the provincial competition, the runner-up quilt will be selected to represent the society in the district competition.
11. At the end of the competition, the quilts will be returned to the quilters.
12. Pictures of the winning quilts and exhibitors are to be kept each year and placed in a traveling album.
13. At the district level prize monies of \$20.00 will be awarded for the two top quilts in each category. At the finals \$1200.00 will be awarded in the hand quilting Category (1st Prize \$750 & 2nd Prize \$450) and \$800.00 in the machine quilting category (1st Prize \$500 & 2nd Prize \$300).
14. Pre-stamped and Cut Quilt kits are **not** allowed to enter, however “Block-of-the-Month’ quilts are eligible for the competition.
15. Quilt is to be available for display at the M.A.A.S. conference until after Saturday night banquet – approximately 10:30 p.m.
16. Quilt owners are responsible for insuring their own quilts. The sponsors, societies, and MAAS will not be liable for damage or loss.
